2. New Business

A. Erie County Trails Workshop, March 23 2-5 at the Erie County Conservation District

1. Background Anna Frantz

This workshop is expected to begin the conversation of how municipalities can define the project that they can work together on whether it is just consistent signage or connections to other trails. The intent is to enhance our trails and outdoor experiences through collaboration.

One of our presenters is the Industrial Heartland Trail Organization which encompasses over 1400 miles of trails. Currently, there is a large gap in the network that could be filled if we can drive local interest and support. There is significant data to support the economic benefits of trails in a community. The focus of the workshop will be to identify existing trails and opportunities and envision potential connections and project opportunities. Since signage has been identified as a need, Cog could help seek funding and grants and assist with the process through the sign trust. Invitees include: DCNR, Visit Erie, Northwest PA Trail Association (need a contact-Greg Troyer possibly), Impact Corry, Port Authority and all municipalities in Erie County.

2. Municipal benefits

A county-wide project can drive investment and use of your existing park and rec opportunities and therefore have economic benefits to our municipalities.

3. COG role

Continue to reach out to invite every municipality to participate in the project. Cog can be applicant for Multi-municipal grant funding.

It was recommended that a non-profit organization purchase land for trails instead of a government entity, Corry has a relatively smooth experience due to this.
